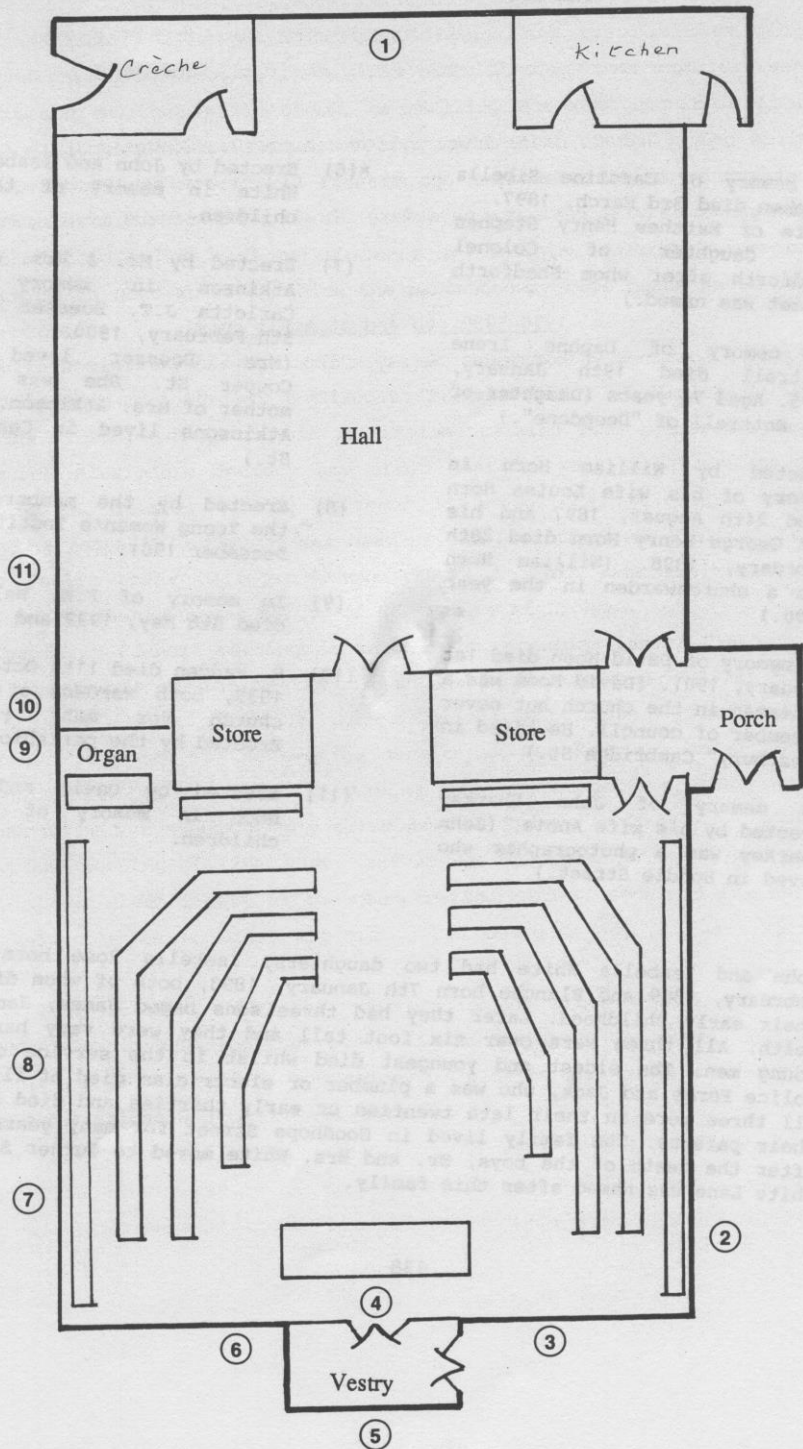


St George's Stained Glass Windows



THE STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

- (1) In memory of Caroline Sibella Stephen died 3rd March, 1897.
(Wife of Matthew Henry Stephen and daughter of Colonel Shadforth after whom Shadforth Street was named.)
- (2) In memory of Daphne Irene Bottrell died 19th January, 1895. Aged 7½ years (Daughter of Dr. Bottrell of "Deepdene".)
- (3) Erected by William Horn in memory of his wife Louisa Horn died 24th August, 1897 and his son George Henry Horn died 28th February, 1898. (William Horn was a churchwarden in the year 1900.)
- (4) In memory of David Moon died 1st January, 1901. (David Moon was a sidesman in the church but never a member of Council. He lived in "Westbury" Cambridge St.)
- (5) In memory of John Sharkey erected by his wife Annie. (John Sharkey was a photographer who lived in Hoddle Street.)
- (6) Erected by John and Isabella White in memory of their children.
- (7) Erected by Mr. & Mrs. J.A. Atkinson in memory of Carlotta J.T. Boesser died 5th February, 1900. (Mrs. Boesser lived in Cooper St. She was the mother of Mrs. Atkinson. The Atkinsons lived in Cascade St.)
- (8) Erected by the members of the Young Women's Institute. December 1901.
- (9) In memory of F.W. Wallace died 5th May, 1939 and
- (10) R. Hadden died 11th October, 1939, both wardens of this church for many years. Erected by the parishioners.
- (11) Erected by David and Ann Moon in memory of their children.

* John and Isabella White had two daughters, Isabella Rose born 14th February, 1889 and Blanche born 7th January, 1893, both of whom died in their early childhood. Later they had three sons named James, Jack and Keith. All three were over six feet tall and they were very handsome young men. The eldest and youngest died whilst in the service of the Police Force and Jack, who was a plumber or electrician died of illness. All three were in their late twenties or early thirties and died before their parents. The family lived in Goodhope Street for many years, but after the death of the boys, Mr. and Mrs. White moved to Gurner Street. White Lane was named after this family.

2 ND November, 1889	St. George's Schoolroom licensed for public worship, on petition of the Rev. A.W. Pain, Rector of St. John's, Darlington.
16 th August, 1892	Rev. D. Laseron, resigned as C. St. John's, Darlington: licensed as Minister in Charge of St. George's, Glenmore Road.
1 st July, 1895	Rev. H.M. Trickett licensed.
1 st January, 1898	Rev. H.M. Trickett resigned.
1 st January, 1898	Rev. Edward Owen B.A., licensed (1898-1900)
1 st March, 1909	Rev. Robert Rook resigned (1900-1909)
1 st May, 1909	Rev. Richard Ord Todd licensed (1900-1909)
29 th July, 1915	Rev. John Bidwell, L.Th. licensed (1915-1919) (Resignation took effect 31st August 1919)
1 st September, 1919	Rev. J. Poole licensed.
21 st January, 1924	Rev. J. Poole resigned.
21 st January, 1924	Rev. C.L. Williams licensed (1924-1927) (became Rector in 1925)
March, 1927	Rev. R. Harley Jones licensed as Rector.
31 st March, 1931	Rev. R. Harley Jones (leave of absence)
1 st April, 1931	Rev. M.G.H. Garbett <i>locum tenens</i> .
1 st March, 1933	Rev. G. Polain licensed as Rector.
3 rd July, 1933	Rev. G. Polain resigned.
14 th August, 1933	Rev. J.R. Le Huray licensed as Rector (1933-1937) Rev. J.T. Phair (1937-1940) Rev. F.A. Reed (1940-1942) Rev. E.C. St. Clair Coleman (1942-1952)

1st December, 1952 Rev. E.C. Coleman resigned.
Rev. R.N. Langshaw (Rector),
Rev. H.W. Robey (Curate) (1953-1954)

3rd February, 1955 Rev. Norman Woodhart licensed as Rector (1955-1975)

6th May, 1975 Rev. Bruce W. Wilson licensed as Rector.

31st December, 1983 Rev. Bruce W. Wilson resigned.

5th May, 1984 Rev. Colin G. Dundon licensed as Rector.
